WITNESSETH: That for and in consideration of the sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) and other good and valuable considerations, receipt of which being hereby acknowledged, the said R. Swann, Inc., a body corporate as aforesaid, does hereby grant and convey unto GEORGE D. 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six courses and distances: (39) North 82 degrees 16 minutes 36 seconds East 292.19 feet to a 12 inch diameter Gum Tree; thence (40) South 82 degrees 00 minutes 26 seconds East 992.03 feet to a Concrete Monument; thence (41) South 50 degrees 22 minutes 47 seconds East 199.81 feet to an Iron Rod; thence (42) South 37 degrees 22 minutes 29 seconds East 1158.53 feet to an Iron Post in a Gully; thence (43) South 59 degrees 31 minutes 50 seconds East 187.25 feet to a Concrete Monument; thence (44) continuing South 59 degrees 31 minutes 50 seconds East 125 feet, more or less, to the Place of Beginning, containing 334.968 Acres of Land, more or less;

BEING SUBJECT TO the following rights-of-way: ONE: A 50foot-wide right-of-way leading from the land of Lawrence W. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said lot or parcel of ground and premises above described and mentioned and hereby intended to be conveyed, together with the rights, privileges, appurtenances and advantages thereto belonging or appertaining unto and to the proper use and benefit of the said George D. Brennan, his heirs and assigns, in fee simple.

AND the said R. Swann, Inc., a body corporate as aforesaid, hereby covenants that it has not done or suffered to be done any act, matter or thing whatsoever to encumber said property hereby conveyed; and that it will execute such other and further assurances of same as may be requisite.
